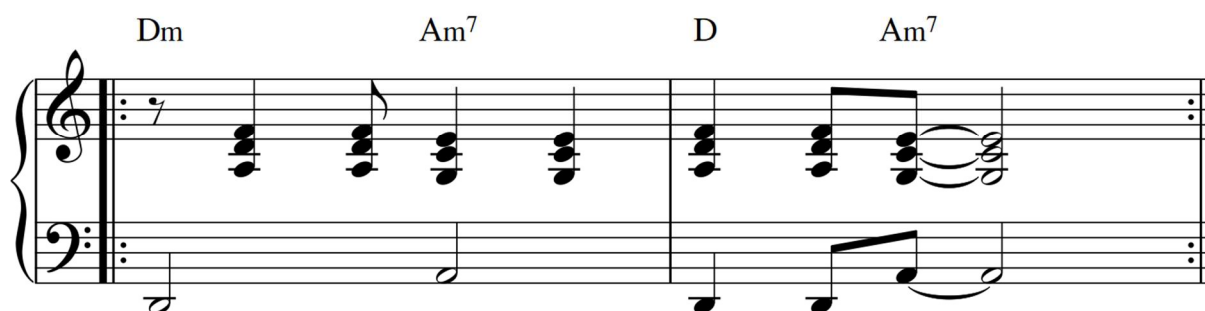
suitable for: KS2 / KS3 / Choirs

*A catchy round, great for singing assemblies or as a rehearsal warm up.*

- D-D' octave range – perfect for a first sing after a warm up
- Works as a 2, 3 or 4 part round (the recording is unison then a 4 part round).
- Suggested actions – *walk on the spot* – *look left, look right* – *sweep hand above (blue skies)*, *sweep both hands in front (sunrise)* – *turn in own circle with jazz hands*.
- Actions are fun and help with learning, but also help keep the body moving freely while we sing. When we sing in a round, actions look nice, help illustrate the part singing and (crucially) help each group to know where they are in the song.

- The underlying harmony is just 2 chords – Dm and Am7 – not too difficult on keyboard, guitar or ukulele.

### PIANO RIFF



- These chords also translate well onto classroom instruments as they use only white notes (see table below). Make chord groups with single note instruments eg. chime bars, boomwhackers – or challenge students to make up their own part using notes from the chords.
